Dear Paul:

Widespread distribution of untaxed cigarettes in New York by criminal elements is threatening the existence of our State's legitimate cigarette industry. The impact of this illegal activity is also felt in the loss of millions of dollars in much-needed public revenues.

In view of this situation, I request that the State Commission of Investigation undertake a thorough examination of criminal involvement in the cigarette industry, with particular emphasis on conditions in New York City. The Commission, in conducting its inquiry, should seek to determine:

- -- the extent and nature of criminal activity in the distribution and sale of cigarettes in New York;
- -- the scope and effectiveness of present law enforcement efforts to combat distribution of contraband cigarettes including police, prosecutorial and judicial practices and procedures; and
- -- the appropriateness of existing laws, federal, state and local, affecting the New York cigarette industry.

I look forward to the results of the Commission's investigation in supplying urgently needed answers to combat this serious area of criminal activity.
